A word about wood and painted finish characteristics

Wood naturally offers variations in color, grains, pattern and texture, creating a uniqueness that adds to its appeal. These natural characteristics can not be hidden in finishing and are not to be misinterpreted as defects.

Painted finishes also feature unique characteristics derived from the wood underneath. Imperfections and natural characteristics of wood will stand out even more on a smooth painted finish. These are to be expected and not considered a defect in the workmanship or finish.

TILE IN STYLE

From (hopefully) dry bathroom floors to wet shower floors, to countertop backsplashes and countless styles, colors and options for shower walls, inlays and niches, tile choices impact the look and feel of every bathroom.

Be sure to discuss:

Size: Large tile for the floor can make a space feel bigger but may not be what you want in the shower.

Colors & Focal Point: With multiple uses of tile, make sure you create a palette of colors and styles that complement each other. One focal point is all you need to make a statement.

Maintenance: No one loves cleaning the bathroom. Porcelain or Ceramic options typically require less maintenance. Natural stones are porous, require more effort to maintain, and must be sealed as well.



how to measure for your **NEW BATHROOM**



- All you need is a tape measure, pencil and piece of paper.
- Starting in a corner, select a wall to measure.
- Note the total length of the wall plus every item on that wall and distances between.
- Repeat for all walls until everything is marked on your sketch.
- Note heights for door openings, windows, floor to ceiling and floor to soffit (if applicable).
- For windows, measure outside of casing to outside of casing.
- For doors, mark direction of door swing.
- Mark locations of sink, shower, tub and toilet.
- Mark locations of outlets and light switches if possible.
